Controversy in the Nationalist Party: Platform Revealed

With the beginning of the 2025 -Boys State, many have been excited to see how the workings of the new Nationalist party will unfold and reveal themselves. However, some may be disappointed with the controversial decision to support the legalization of gambling as a new party platform. The Nationalist party platform meeting at 11:15 on Monday, May 26th, voted to support the legalization of gambling in Alabama after close debate between both sides. Those against the legalization claimed that the inclusion of gambling into commonplace society would cause an increase in crime, addiction, and financial ruin for Alabama citizens. However, those for argued that the increase in state funding from taxes would help for the maintenance of failing city and road infrastructure, and more funding for public education. While the motion passed with a majority affirmation, many are still uncertain of readers at Boys' State in the know. the party's political future.

The Nationalist party also has platformed topics focusing on the economy, education, and infrastructure sectors. Nationalists also made the decision to increase the tax percentage on "sin taxes," which are taxes on "sinful" products like alcohol or tobacco. The Nationalists claim that they can use the increased sin taxes and gambling taxes to improve education and infrastructure of Alabama. This spans from increasing scholarships to annual infrastructure checks to the maintenance of roads and bridges. Many in the party have specifically shown dismay to the sin tax. The vote went into a runoff vote after the party could not come to a consensus. But soon after the sin tax increase was affirmed as a platform.

With these new platforms revealed it is tough to say if this will benefit the Nationalist party or not, but we are sure to keep the
